<i>WRL</i>	Includes a day on placement, learning skills and responsibility in a real working environment, supported by school based sessions following the OCR “Preparing for Employment” course.	
<i>Hair &amp; Beauty</i>	Performing nail and facial treatments, working with clients in beauty outlets, performing shampoo/condition/dry hair, help with perming/colouring, working in hair salons	
<i>Construction</i>	Practical training in Brickwork, Blockwork, Stonework, Carpentry/Joinery, Painting/Decorating Plumbing/heating	
<i>Hospitality</i>	Practical Cookery, Hygiene at work, Table and Beverage Service, Nutrition at Work	
<i>Engineering</i>	Includes Welding and Fabrication, Electrical installation	
<i>Motor Vehicle Maintenance</i>	Repair and servicing, learn about Engine Technology, Steering/Suspension systems, Electronic	

### **Work Related Learning (WRL) and Vocational Courses (At Highlands)**
