Uniform/Basic Rules Policy

Uniform

The Grainville School uniform is a fixed dress code that helps the students to perform academically better by creating a sense of community, allowing students to concentrate more on their studies. We believe that it is an essential part of the ethos and discipline structure that all pupils manage the way in which they present themselves and comply with the school uniform requirements. We are very proud of our community at Grainville and want all our young people to show that they are too, by wearing our uniform with pride.

School uniform consists of a school blazer, shirt, tie and trousers for both boys and girls. School tank tops and jumpers with the school crest are optional with the blazer.

All students wear trousers. In order to deal with the problem of shrinking hemlines and to set the highest of standards, skirts are not permitted as part of the school uniform. Skirts are often worn too short which can compromise girl's dignity on stairwells and in practical subjects. We offer an active curriculum and trousers are more comfortable and practical.

Uniform summary

- School blazer (Note: Year 7 and 8 students have a new style blazer that includes a platinum trim to the collar. All other students in Years 9-11 will retain the current school blazer without the trim. The new blazer will be phased in one year at a time over the next 3 years). Blazer sleeves must not be rolled up.
- Trousers – plain black straight long leg trousers for boys and girls. Trousers must be an appropriate length, covering the ankle and no skin to be shown. Note that the school trousers are not jeans, cords, chinos, jeggings, or leggings and must not be tight at the ankle. Trousers must not be rolled up.
- Shirt – light blue, school style and must be tucked in at all times. Prefects must wear a white shirt.
- School tie – all with the Grainville crest. Various styles for Year 7/8 and prefects.
- Socks – full length dark socks that must be above the ankle so that no skin is shown. Short trainer socks of any colour are not permitted.
- Shoes – plain black shoes must be suitable for school. Trainers or any shoes that have any other colour (including logo) are not permitted
- Optional: jumper/tank top with the Grainville crest.

Additional information/guidance

- In cold weather, a dark-coloured outdoor coat may be worn to come to school in but is not to be worn in classrooms, corridors or anywhere inside the school building. Coats need to be placed in bags or the student locker upon arrival.
- Hoodies, baseball caps, scarves and associated fashion clothing are not permitted in school and will be confiscated if worn. The confiscated item of clothing can be collected at the end of the school day.
- The school reserves the right to ask a student to go home and change, if their uniform does not fulfil the criteria in this policy (subject to parental permission).
- Any headwear worn for religious purposes must be Navy/Black (apart from in PE lessons)

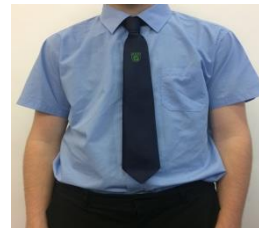
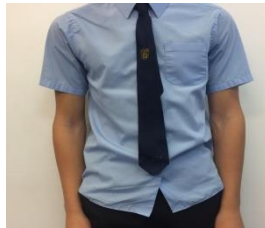

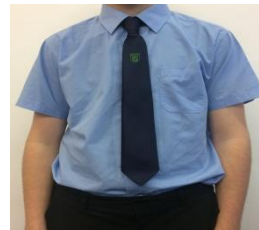

Basic Rules

Mobile Phones and Headphones (inc Ipods mp3's etc.)

Mobile phones can ONLY be used in the canteen and Year 11 Centre before school, at break and at lunchtimes. If a student is seen with a mobile phone outside these areas it will be immediately confiscated and put into the front office by the member of staff. This can then be collected at 2.50pm by the student. If the phone is confiscated a second time it will be taken and put in the main office for collection by the parent. This will happen in subsequent times too. In an emergency, students may contact home from the main office.

Hair

This should be traditionally styled and of a natural colour – extreme dyed colours or tramlines are NOT permitted. Students arriving into school with extreme dyed colours or tramlines will not be permitted to attend lessons until they conform to our schools expectations and parents will be contacted.

Make-up

Discreet and minimum make up may be worn where appropriate. However, students will be asked to remove make-up that the senior leadership team deems unacceptable or inappropriate.

Jewellery

There should be no visible jewellery (including material wristbands) other than a watch, one matching pair of flat small stud earrings and one plain ring. These should be placed in the lower ear lobe and NOT the mid or upper ear. **Nose studs, eyebrow or tongue piercing or any other facial piercings are not allowed for health and safety reasons.** Students will not be permitted to access lessons until these have been removed.

All jewellery must be removed before PE lessons as it can cause injury. It is NOT sufficient to 'cover with tape'. Our school policy concerning valuables is on display in the PE department.

Hoodies

No student should be wearing a hoodie, sweatshirt or cardigan either in school or on the journey to and from school. If a student is seen wearing any of the above items, they will be taken and put in the main office to be collected at 2.50pm. In some cases students may be sent home to change into appropriate uniform. During Charity Days (non-uniform) students are not permitted to wear clothing which has offensive slogans or imagery or anything that promotes the use of drug taking. Coats are not permitted inside the building during or between lessons.

Nail Polish

This is not permitted to be worn in school. We also do not allow acrylic or gel nails. These will be required to be removed at main reception.

Smoking/Vaping

Smoking / Vaping is not permitted in any part of the school's premises and grounds including the entrance area to the school, on land adjacent to the school building (e.g. car parks, garden areas, walkways, playgrounds, playing fields etc.) This applies to all events / activities held in the school including before and after school sessions.

This applies to students, staff, parents/carers, members of the public, contractors or others using the school premises or all vehicles used to transport students.

Students are not permitted to smoke / vape when in uniform or when representing the school in any capacity.
