

## Support and Guidance for Year 7, 8 and 9 students in 2020

### What to do if the school has to close unexpectedly.

Art	All students in years 7, 8 and 9 are to access their school email account where there is a PowerPoint with all instructions on. This is to be submitted upon return to school.
Design Technology	<p>Food Studies: All students have been sent an email and given access to a Class Notebook for their Year group, with full instructions on how to access materials and complete revision tasks. Completed work is to be emailed or uploaded and shared to Mrs Cooper or Mrs Allo or submitted upon return to school. Content will be added should school's closure be extended. We also encourage students, with home permission, to get involved with practical cooking and baking.</p> <p><a href="#">Design Technology: All students can access learning via their class notebook on OneNote. There are a selection of information pages to read through followed by a worksheet to complete. Students can complete the tasks on paper and when back in school they can be added to their Design Technology exercise books. In addition all students are asked to design and make a pennant for the Liberation 75 celebrations – full details of which can also be found on OneNote.</a></p>
English Language	English Language: All students in years 8 and 9 are to access their school email account or OneNote where there are resources to complete. This is to be submitted upon return to school. Year 9 are working on a Dystopian Assessment to be submitted by April 3 <sup>rd</sup> .

<b>French</b>	<p>Students have access to a One Note class notebook for each of their classes with resources and tasks to complete. In addition, each student has a login for Studio Active Learn and there are other website suggestions below.</p>
<b>Geography</b>	<p>Students have access to a OneNote Class Notebook. Content will be added to this Notebook by Mrs Falle.</p>
<b>History</b>	<p>Students have access to a OneNote Class Notebook. Content will be added to this Notebook by Mr Pitman / Mrs Kohlbeck on each day the class would normally have a Humanities lesson.</p>
<b>ICT</b>	<p>All students can access learning through their OneNote class notebook.</p>
<b>Mathematics</b>	<p>Year 8- Groups all have access to a OneNote Class Notebook which will have content added to it on a weekly basis by.</p> <p>Year 9 - Groups all have access to a OneNote Class Notebook which will have content added to it on a weekly basis. <b>Music</b>	<p>Please find below a selection of musical options you can complete from home. You can attempt all of them or focus on a few or just one:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. If you sing or play an instrument please complete some personal practice. Ideally at least 20 minutes at least 4 times a week.</li> <li>2. If you are an enthusiastic singer then sing some home kareoke. Focus on different styles (genres) of music to widen your skills.</li> <li>3. Try to make a home instrument from household objects. For example a carrot recorder or a pots and pans drum kit (check out STOMP ON YOUTUBE).</li> </ol>

	<p>4. In line with our Film Music project try and listen to film themes and learn them on an instrument of your choice.</p> <p>5. Compose a rap song by getting a rap backing track from youtube and creating lyrics over the top. Enjoy</p>
<b>Drama</b>	<p>Students have access to a OneNote Class Notebook. Content will be added to this Notebook including creative writing, script writing and stage design tasks.</p>
<b>Physical Education</b>	<p>Worksheets for all years will be emailed to all students on Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> March. These range from sport specific tasks, word searches and basic GCSE theory tasks. Alongside this, home workouts will be included along with a range of websites to visit to ensure students stay active whilst they are off school and within the home environment.</p> <p>We will also be regularly posting on our Grainville PE Instagram page with new ideas of workouts.
